Message from the CEO



We are the credit union of opportunity and promise for all of our members, and we're going to make sure we make that dream a reality for every member.

Pelican has always remained centered around serving our members, and 2023 was no different.

We ended the year with \$668 million in assets and over 70,000 members. We're grateful for the opportunity to be able to help more people throughout the state.

The credit union held 2,541 oneon-one credit counseling sessions this year and 245 Financial Wellness Workshops.

Our introduction of free online education tools helped 4,588 youth and adults learn new skills to assist them in making smart financial decisions.

We partnered with 3 Louisiana schools in 2023 for our School Pride Debit Card Program, bringing our total to 10 school partnerships. The program earns the schools 5 cents each time a Pelican member uses their card, and in 2023 we paid out \$1,980 to 10 schools.

This year, our Kasasa Cash Checking Account beat out 650 accounts in the nation and was named WalletHub's Best Credit Union Checking Account, giving us national recognition for our 6.05% APY.



In October 2023, we also partnered with Kasasa and social media influencer and Dream Machine Foundation CEO Charlie Rocket to surprise Pelican member Ida Jean and her grandchildren with a new car, \$8,000, a parade in downtown Baton Rouge, and a proclamation from Baton Rouge Mayor-President Sharon Weston Broome. This helped the credit union spread our mission across the globe.

At Pelican, our shared goal is to make a positive impact on every member at each stage of their life. We are the credit union of opportunity and promise for all of our members, and we're going to make sure we make that dream a reality for every member.

I would like to express my deepest gratitude and appreciation to the Board of Directors for their engagement. Your efforts are reflected each day and contribute to the credit union's success.





Youth Outreach and School Partnerships

Dollars for A's

Our Dollars for A's program was a driving force for our youth members to keep working hard in school. In 2023, we gave out \$95,696 to our youth members for making A's!

Team Pelican Youth Awards

Our Team Pelican Youth Awards program rewards \$100 to 10 elementary and middle school students who exemplify our Core Values—Positive Attitude, Growth Mindset, Heart for Service, Commitment to Excellence, and Ownership. In 2023, we awarded \$1,000 in Youth Awards to students from our local communities.

Team Pelican Scholarship Program

We awarded \$15,000 to graduating Louisiana high school seniors through our Team Pelican Scholarship Award Program. Since the scholarship program launched 16 years ago, we have awarded \$144,500 in Team Pelican scholarships.

Girl Scouts of Louisiana

Pelican has partnered with Girl Scout Troops across Louisiana to empower these young women with the money-smart skills they need to be savvy savers and successful entrepreneurs in the future. Pelican offers a custom badge for Girl Scouts to earn for completing a Financial Wellness Workshop!









Family Favorites

In 2023, Pelican was voted the #1 Credit Union in BR Parents Magazine! This award is voted on by the public and recognizes our impact on the families in our community. Thank you for voting and naming us a Family Favorite.

Growing School Partnerships

In 2023, three schools joined our School Pride Debit Card Program— Lake Charles College Prep, JS Clark Academy, and Northwest High School.

Our School Pride Debit Cards make it easy for schools to fundraise. Schools can earn 5 cents each time a Pelican member uses their card. The cardholders also get a special card design to show their school pride! As of 2023, ten schools across Louisiana participate in this program, and we've paid out \$1,980 to them.

This past year, we met our schools' growing financial education needs by adapting our School Branch experience to bring even more fun to financial literacy. Our team is regularly out attending sporting events, pep rallies, and other schoolsponsored events to increase awareness about our youth products and services, providing the tools for financial success.

Desjardins Youth Financial Education Award

In 2023, Pelican's efforts to spread financial literacy throughout Louisiana were recognized by the Louisiana Credit Union League, and the credit union was awarded the Desjardins Financial Education Award. The award recognizes leadership within the credit union movement on behalf of financial literacy for all ages.









Empowering Financial Growth



Opportunity Knocked, Pelican Answered

In May 2023, Pelican State Credit Union's commitment to helping families and individuals reach financial stability extended to the small screen when we appeared on PBS' newest show "Opportunity Knock\$" alongside Lake Charles couple and Pelican members, Charles and Tiffany White. Pelican's Community Development Financial Institution (CDFI) certification made us the perfect credit union to participate in the television show.

One of Pelican's Nationally Certified Credit Counselors worked with the White family to improve their credit, create a reasonable budget, and save money by refinancing their loans with Pelican.

The success of the show led the credit union to winning its first-ever Telly Award for Best Reality Television Program. Opportunity Knock\$ beat out several other industry-leading shows in the category to secure the prestigious award.

Online Education Modules

In 2023, Pelican launched free online financial education lessons for both adults and children. Our online youth lessons assisted 120 teens through 377 lessons to learn how to manage their finances by smart budgeting, saving, and investing. The adult lessons serve as the perfect complement to Pelican's free credit counseling sessions and assisted 4,468 adults through 1,795 lessons to reach financial goals.

Financial Wellness Program

Pelican and its team of Nationally Certified Credit Counselors continued their commitment to spreading financial wellness across Louisiana in 2023. The team achieved this through our 100% free educational services, which include lessons on debt consolidation, budgeting, credit score fundamentals, and more!

participation in the most recent GAC
allowed us to share concerns on hot
topic issues such as overdraft fees
and interchange rates.

Even at the national level, proposed policy changes like these can profoundly impact our daily lives. While these changes seem insignificant, they can have a ripple effect by causing increased prices, elimination of rewards, and even loss of access to vital financial education services.

Our designation as a Community Development Financial Institution (CDFI) played an important role in highlighting how credit unions put people first, support economic development and job creation, and provide access to mainstream financial products and services to underserved communities throughout Louisiana.
